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| Title and brief description | PSYCM501 History and Basic Characteristics of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). This micro-credential will provide students with foundational knowledge required for understanding FASD. This will include covering the historical and social context of FASD, characteristics of FASD and common comorbidities. Students completing both 1) History and basic characteristics of FASD and 2) Considerations for FASD diagnosis may be eligible to complete the Graduate Certificate in the Diagnosis and Assessment of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (cc: 73260), which will provide clinicians with the skills required for conducting assessments for which FASD is a differential. |
