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Title and brief description	LAWSM105 #Law4GenerationSelfie. This unit i ntroduces students to several different areas of important, interesting and relatively contemporary legal issues. These topics may include: how popular culture portrays lawyers and the courts; emojis and the law; influencers and the law; artificial intelligence and the law and Body Image Law. Importantly, students learn to critically analyse how the law has changed to adapt to technology.
Certified learning	(1) explain and critically analyse how some of the following impact the law: emojis, influencers, the internet of things, fashion, popular culture, body image, artificial intelligence and social media; (2) evaluate whether current law has sufficiently adapted to advances in technology (e.g. the internet of things); (3) contribute respectfully and meaningfully to discussion on Microsoft Teams; and (4) use appropriate oral communication skills.
