## **Experience-based entry** New 2023 Entry Program

## **Experience-based entry**



#### What is Experience Based Entry?

- Experience based entry provides a process of assessing a student's entire profile and taking a holistic assessment approach to determining eligibility to UWA.
- A five-year pilot program enabling a broader range of students to apply to UWA
- We are seeking the best, brightest and most passionate students in WA to join our community and we recognise these students come from different study and experience backgrounds.
- We value a student's life experiences, achievements, commitments, and varied levels of education and will use these attributes when assessing applications for Experience-based entry.

#### When does it Commence?

• We opened applications in December 2022 for commencement in semester one 2023.

## **Experience-based entry**



#### What courses are available?

Students can apply for our comprehensive undergraduate bachelor's degrees and choose from a wide variety of majors;

- Bachelor of Arts
- <u>Bachelor of Business</u>
- <u>Bachelor of Biomedical Science</u>
- <u>Bachelor of Commerce</u>
- <u>Bachelor of Environmental Design</u>
- <u>Bachelor of Science</u>

Students who wish to study another course can commence in one of the degrees listed above before transferring to their preferred course. Students will need to meet <u>UWA's rules for transfer</u>.

## How it Works



Students apply to UWA using a combination of academic and life experiences (either complete or incomplete) and may include:

- Academic qualifications including ATAR and General subjects, VET awards.
- Extra-curricular activities: Shark Tank, Cambridge Project, Micro-credentials, Enabling Units
- Community engagement/Volunteering
- Life and sporting achievements
- Work experience
- Education references

Applications are assessed using a points system. Points are awarded for each item submitted and the total number of points determines a student's eligibility for their chosen course.

## Supporting documents



Students must submit supporting documentation for each life achievement or experience as part of their application.

Documents which may be submitted include evidence of:

- Completed AQF awards (Level II-IV) or an incomplete AQF Diploma
- Completed ATAR and ATAR subjects (completed interstate only. We have access to results completed in WA)
- Completed general subjects (completed interstate only. We have access to results completed in WA)
- Completed high school or other awards completed interstate or overseas
- Extra-curricular awards or certificates
- Work experience (resume)
- Life achievements and commitments (including sport, music, volunteering etc)
- Education references

## **Points Examples**



Academic achievements are assessed according to the level and grades received.

- ATAR between 60 and 74.95 50-60 points towards eligibility
- Individual ATAR subjects (Maximum of five) 15 points each towards eligibility
- General Subjects (Grade A or B) (Maximum of five) Up to 10 points each towards eligibility
- Completed AQF Certificate II-IV (Highest Qualification will be used) Up to 60 points towards eligibility
- Completed University Enabling Units (Maximum of four) 15 points each towards eligibility

## **Other Examples**



Experiences and activities are assessed according to their degree of difficulty or award status.

> Sports

Sporting participation is broken down into three categories;

- Elite
- Sub-elite
- Developmental

Each level providing a different number of points towards a student's total entry score.

#### > Music

Musical achievements at level AMEB 5 and 7 provide different points to a students score.

#### >Volunteering/Community Engagement/Work Experience

Experiences such as volunteering have a single score component.

## Eligibility & How to Apply



#### Eligibility

- Available to Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens, Australian permanent residents and holders of permanent humanitarian visas.
- Students need to satisfy the University's English Language Competency requirements through secondary school or a recognised test of English or completion of a Communications unit at UWA.
- Students need to satisfy the prerequisite requirements for their chosen course either through secondary school or bridging units completed at UWA.

#### How to apply

- Secondary school students would apply for their preferred course via **TISC** or **direct to UWA**.
- School leavers will be required to complete WACE as well as any other specified qualifications within their application.

## FAQs



## What work will be required from teachers, career advisors and school principals to support a student's Experience-based entry application?

We have designed this program to have minimal impact on schools. However, students may seek an education reference from a teacher or recommendation from the school to support their application.

#### How does this program compare to alternative-entry pathways other Universities offer?

This entry-program has similarities to portfolio entry at other universities and Edith Cowan University's Experience Based Entry Scheme.

## What sort of work experience is required? Does it have to be related to the course the student wishes to study?

A student's work experience does not need to relate to the course they wish to apply for. Work experience is recognised for the experience, the commitment, the level and duration. Each factor will assist us in determining a student's eligibility for UWA's comprehensive undergraduate bachelor degree courses.

## FAQs



#### Does Experience-based entry impact Assured Pathway applications?

This program is only available to students entering into our comprehensive undergraduate bachelor's degrees.

#### How does Experience-based entry impact students from UWA Broadway schools?

We have designed this program to have no direct impact on the Broadway UWA pathway. Broadway students who achieve a final ATAR of 70.00 will continue to have an ATAR adjustment made and will become eligible for UWA courses. This program will support students who have an ATAR below our entry requirements or who have not completed ATAR.

#### Is this an adjustment factor scheme? Do ATAR students receive additional points to their raw ATAR?

This program does not adjust a student's ATAR. A student's final ATAR or individual ATAR subjects will be used in conjunction with other experiences and achievements to determine eligibility for our courses.

## FAQs



#### Is Experience-based entry considered a part of UWA Early Offers?

This would be a standalone program. A students final ATAR or individual ATAR subjects would be used in conjunction with other life achievements and experiences to determine eligibility for our courses. School leavers applying early will be required to complete WACE and any qualifications identified within their application.

#### Will this conflict with the students existing academic requirements?

We have designed this program to support the experiences and achievements of students completing WACE, VET and General Courses pathways. These, in conjunction with other student attributes, would allow students to pursue a university degree at UWA.

#### What support services will be provided to students?

We have services for health, wellbeing and academic success to ensure our student's get the help and support they need to succeed. Student's would also have the opportunity to connect with a wide support network of peers to encourage them along the way. Student performance throughout this program would also be closely monitored.

#### Early Offers:

Currently no update to UWA Early Offers for 2024, school leavers must:

- Complete WACE;
- Achieve a final ATAR;
- Satisfy English;
- Satisfy course prerequisites.


#### Broadway:

We are currently reviewing Broadway ATAR adjustments with a view to amending the adjustment scale at the top end, any changes will not disadvantage students, including Medicine and Dentistry.

## **Medicine Changes**



- Introduction of Bachelor of Biomedicine as the school leaver pathway to Medicine, Dentistry and Podiatry.
- Minimum ATAR of 92.00 as a standalone degree with Medical Science Specialisation.
- Each Pathway has its own Extended major within the degree
  - Integrated Medical Sciences and Clinical Practice
  - Integrated Dental Sciences
  - Podiatric Health and Medical Sciences
- Competitive entry no change to ATAR requirements, UCAT ANZ and Interview requirements still apply for Medicine and Dentistry.





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


# 2024 Future Students scholarships
